
Florida Statutes 383.145: all newborns screened

- All licensed hospitals and birthing facilities providing maternity and newborn care
 - Screen prior to discharge
- Home births also require referral
 - within 30 days after birth


Screening Methods

- Auditory Brain Response (ABR)
- Otoacoustic Emissions Testing (OAE)

Otoacoustic Emissions Testing (OAE)



Auditory Brain Response (ABR)





- Fail in one or both ears
- Performed one to two times
- Conducted by licensed or trained professionals

Sequence of Events

Performed a few hours after birth to 30 days after discharge using the OAE or ABR

Fail

Pass

Status recorded on newborn screening card and the hearing screening is completed

Rescreened (either in hospital or after) and the status is recorded on the newborn screening card



Referred to Audiologist within 15 working days of failing screen and follow-up letter or phone call made by Newborn Hearing Screening Staff



Status recorded on newborn screening card and the hearing screening is completed



Confirmation

Referred for medical management, and to the CMS Early Intervention Program

State of Florida 2012 Department of Health Data (1-25-13)		
Total newborns screened	204,000	
Total passed	197,293	97%
Total referred due to failure of initial screen (presumptive positives)	6,707	3%
Total with actual hearing impairment from those referred	169	2.5%

- About 1 in 28 babies referred have confirmed hearing loss
- ~ 1/1,200 babies born in Florida have confirmed hearing loss
